345.1 Rule

HIGH SCHOOL GRADING PROCEDURES

1. The high school grading system is as follows:

A – Excellent

B – Good

C – Average

D – Below Average

F – Failure - If a student receives an “F” in a required subject, he/she must repeat and pass that subject to fulfill graduation requirements. Ordinarily, a student who receives an “F” in a course that is part of a sequence must repeat and pass that course to continue in the sequence.

I – Incomplete –When a student’s work is not completed by the end of the quarter, due to being absent from school, he/she receives an “I”. This work, in most cases, must be made up within two weeks after the end of the quarter. Exceptions to the two-week period must be cleared through the principal. If work is not made up in the required time, the “I” becomes an “F”.

W – Withdrew – A student receives this grade when he/she drops a course with administrative approval. A student withdrawing from a course after the fifth week of the semester will do so with an “F” unless granted an administrative exception.

2. Determination of grade point equivalents is as follows:

A = 4.0

A- = 3.666

B+ = 3.333

B = 3.0

B- = 2.666

C+ = 2.333

C = 2.0

C- = 1.666

D+ = 1.333

D = 1.0
